

Riches of His Glory

I keep hearing... *“But my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus”* (Philippians 4:19). To understand this scripture we must look beyond what we can see. Although we cannot see God’s glory realms to know the depths of His great riches, God does give us an ability to gain understanding through divine revelations.

First, God’s riches are without end—as is His love, His faith and more. Years ago, in one of my prayer times, I was talking to God about His riches, and He said to me... “If I were to give you all my riches today, I would have that and much more before tomorrow.” (It’s truly amazing how God can give it all away and still own it all!) He was letting me know that we simply cannot exhaust His riches. Furthermore, His glory is without end. It is an eternal principle that cannot be changed. If God were to grant to you the riches of His knowledge, yet again, you would attain great wealth. Yet even attaining great wealth in the earth is nothing in comparison to attaining an ever-present God within your spirit and body.

Realize that having the entire being of God in your midst, with all His wealth, is worth far more than even the riches of His wisdom, knowledge, or understanding. Just being in His presence is a fullness—an absolute fullness of joy, fullness of happiness, fullness of real freedom, fullness of true unconditional love, of peace beyond measure, and along with it the feeling of being fully accepted—and even celebrated. Look at this in Ephesians 3:16-19, *“that He would grant **you**, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man; that Christ may dwell in **your** hearts by faith; that **you**, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth and length and depth and height, and to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge, that **you** might be filled with all the fullness of God.”* You—you are the person God wants to be with. He wants to give you all the fullness of Himself. So, no matter what your need, keep pursuing His presence. He is the One who owns it all and wants to supply all your needs. By surrendering to Him with thankfulness for His gifts of generosity, you can expect the fullness of Him and the riches of His glory.

Thank you for giving them the riches of salvation, with heavenly gifts of wisdom, knowledge, mercy, and love.
