Miracles for You

You have waited so long for your miracle(s) to happen that perhaps your heart has become discouraged. When waiting for a long time, the ability to remain in faith can become weak. And you may wonder, "Has God changed His mind?" But please allow me to reinforce the promise that God spoke to you. Your life is not over—your best is yet to come! Your miracle(s) will still happen.

I must remind you that the lame man waited at the pool for 38 years for the stirring of the waters so he could be healed. But one day Jesus came, spoke to him, and the lame man got up and walked (John 5:1-9). Others who had desired a miracle (but didn't know it was possible) received theirs. Remember that Job chose to remain believing God against all odds and said, "I will wait till my change comes" (Job 14:14). He knew that God had allowed him to experience hardships, so he landed on his knees and glorified God anyway. He didn't know that God was proving to Satan that he would keep his faith (Job 2:3). This is how Job came to know the God of the miraculous—and afterwards, all that Job had lost God doubled back to him (Job 42:10). So I say, your miracle will happen—don't give up the wait.

I am for sure that you have seen miraculous happenings—sometimes without noticing. There are miracles of people surviving that shouldn't have, receiving food or shelter miraculously, or finances coming out of nowhere. For sure you can recall unexplainable happenings, and you knew it was a miracle from God. But know that *you* are a miracle! And God is the miracle worker. Therefore, God is always at work doing miracles for you—even if you don't notice it. So, continue looking for God to work your miracle(s).

Some years ago, my baby girl had a fever so high that you could smell her skin burning. We gave her fever medication, but we knew the power of calling on God. Hours later her fever broke, and she never had any residual effects from the fever. She was perfectly normal. But recently I was almost in a head-on collision and even felt the impact. When I stopped to survey the damage, I only had a small amount of black paint on my vehicle—God had indeed given me a miracle without my asking! A few weeks later, another road incident happened where God miraculously intervened. God has worked many such miracles in my life—and He still does. And I am quite sure that you've had such encounters as well.

Know that you are just as important to God! He has already performed many miracles for you—and will continue to do so. But some miracles God holds until an appointed time. So if you've not had the miracle you've sought, don't let the enemy talk you into unbelief. You are so important to God that He must make your miracle happen at just the right moment. His love for you is beyond the miraclous! He will answer.
